



# Amazing year for Dame Vera Lynn Children's Charity!

Dame Vera Lynn Children's Charity is celebrating its first anniversary since relocating to new premises in Cuckfield. After opening its doors in February they have welcomed more than 25 families, who now attend weekly sessions at the Centre. The Charity offers an early intervention service for families with children under five who have cerebral palsy and other motor learning disabilities. They also offer additional activities to families such as swimming, music therapy, messy play, sensory sessions and an outreach support service.

All of this has been made possible due to the wonderful support and generosity of individual donors, companies and the local community. The Charity was thrilled to have recently received a donation of £10,000 from the auction of a portrait of Dame Vera by impressionist Sherree Valentine-Daines. The painting was auctioned at an event organised by Clarendon Fine Art at their gallery in Mayfair to support Dame Vera Lynn Children's Charity and was attended by Dame Vera's daughter Virginia Lewis-Jones.

Immediately after Christmas is often a time when families evaluate their elderly relatives' needs – having spent a good number of hours in their company. David Dimelow, director of Everycare Mid Sussex, explains why this is the case: "We always get an increased number of enquiries in January and it's simply due to the family seeing small changes in their loved ones. "We know that many carers just need a break, and often don't enjoy their own holidays if they are worried about loved ones for whom they usually care. Our carers can be briefed to act just as you would have done, so you can relax!"

# **DESIGN AT HOME**

What will be in, what will be out? If you like to follow trends and predictions in interior design here are some pointers for 2018.

The grey neutral palette is still a popular base (let's not include battleship grey) in a design scheme but overall the trend is moving towards bold colour. Amongst the colour trends for 2018 is Farrow and Ball's Studio Green, a very dark green which can appear almost black but alters in depth and shade with the changing light. Dulux has revealed that Heart Wood is their colour choice for 2018, an attractive greyish pink, and Aquamarine is the choice from Little Greene paint. Goodbye to white walls then and bring on the bold colours! Perhaps just a little at a time if you're not sure, such as a boldly painted kitchen cupboard or chair to make a statement.

Natural materials such as wood or stone will be a trend for 2018 and wooden panelling is a great way to add structure and style to an interior and provides an alternative way to display art. Depending on your style, Shaker or tongue and groove panels are great choices and look fabulous painted in bold or dark colours (if you would rather paint them than keep the exposed wood). Wallpaper with a panelled design is an easy and cheaper alternative.

If you would prefer modern panels there is a fantastic selection of textured and sculpted designs in wood, plywood and other materials which would create a great backdrop on walls and alcoves adding style and a luxurious finish.

The use of natural stone in interiors is growing in popularity with a seemingly endless choice of stone and finishes for floors and walls.

Alternatively, floors covered in herringbone parquet either composed of wood or vinyl will remain on trend. To be unique and perhaps a bit 'wacky', how about coloured parquet or amazing multi coloured parquet that you can design yourself? There are some great ideas and choices online.

Textured tactile fabrics just asking to be stroked, such as velvet, faux fur, woven, knitted or crocheted, will add depth and cosiness to an interior. It looks like textured velvet will be a popular choice of fabric for 2018, so a sofa upholstered in dark green velvet would be a great choice.

Mixed metals furnishings and accessories are right on trend; glistening copper, brass, gold, silver or steel. Brass lampshade frames, beautiful copper baths, copper coffee tables, metallic flecks in floor tiles and panels, the list is endless.

Botanical designs with large leaves and floral wallpaper and fabric in a large print, such as that sold by House of Hackney, is 'of the moment' and would create a fantastic impact and wow factor on entering an interior bringing 'the outside in'. Gentle botanical wallpapers by Farrow and Ball complement their paints beautifully for a more restful interior. Include green house plants and cushions to add depth and focus for a 2018 stylish interior.

# Magic moments

Dom Kenrick believes in special moments. Moments that children will remember. Moments that will enrich their lives.

Mr Kenrick has been Head of Warden Park Academy for just one term but has already stamped his mark on the school with this approach.

His is the first face most pupils will see when they arrive in the morning and the last face they see as they leave in the afternoon as he sees the kids off, encouraging, praising and looking hungrily at any apple pies baked in food technology that day! "I'll be out there in the morning to welcome students into school and in the evening I walk down to the road and wave the kids off and say thanks for all your hard work. It is important to do it so that students know that I think what they have done today matters. Perhaps they've got something that they've baked in food technology class or a piece of art work or something they have made, I will always ask about it. These little moments of recognition are important as they help to build confidence, resilience and self-esteem. Lots of the work students do is very challenging therefore it is important that they feel proud about what they have accomplished."

His approach makes him a popular figurehead following his move in the summer from Steyning Grammar. And he has been pleasantly surprised by the number of girls at the school who get involved in sport and are succeeding in other areas of the school curriculum.

"There's a massive number of young ladies here who are bucking the trend from every other school I've worked in, who are getting involved, being successful and being great role models, and hopefully going on to be healthy, successful adults in the future," he explains.

"We've got girls working in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) and Year 8 girls working in coding – computer science at the Amex.

"There are a lot of opportunities for girls to play sport here, and they are picking it up. Here, more than in other schools I have worked in, it's cool to be doing these things.

"The number of kids who are here at 8 o'clock in the morning to play netball is fantastic.

That is all helped by teachers committing and parents supporting that by dropping them off early.

"The girls football Year 10/11 are playing National and County Cup and hopes are high of reaching a final this year."

Dom grew up in North London but moved to Haywards Heath in the late 1980s

where he taught at St Paul's, when it was located in Oathall Road, then moved jobs to Chailey and then Steyning before landing in Cuckfield.

"There's a depth of tradition here – when I moved to Haywards Heath in 1989 people always associated Warden Park with excellence.

"One question I have always asked students throughout my career in whatever school I've been at is 'how many marks would you give out of ten for today?'. It's a good way to encapsulate views.

"The most common answer is seven. But here at Warden Park the most common answer is an eight or a nine! Twelve weeks in and I'm proud, really proud.

"There's something here in the students' psyche. Is it a combination of home, something about the school, the diet they're getting, the way relationships are here? But the majority here say eight or nine. A lot of students say ten to me, which is fantastic.

"I don't think there's real mystery to working successfully with young people," he says. "You've got to find something that binds them in a way that they can make sense of it and the thing that binds everybody is human contact – young people need to feel it is ok to be who they are and not try to be as others might want them to be.

"There are lots of things that young people buy into; my role is to ensure they buy into their education.

"Qualifications are getting harder, and exam results are always going to be important because they are the 'ticket' to the next phase of education and without them doors close. However, young people are growing up in a generation where image is particularly important, 'where do I fit in?', 'what do I look like?', 'what do people think of me?' - it's tough for them. It is important that education does more than just provide qualifications. I also want our young people to grow up to be good parents, good partners, good neighbours, good citizens; able to manage well their physical, social and mental health. My role is to help ensure our young people leave school strong in the things that exams will never measure - self-esteem, curiosity, resilience, growth mindset, kindness."





# Classic cars in Cuckfield

Back in November hundreds of ordinary and extraordinary classic vehicles passed through Cuckfield as part of the London to Brighton Veteran Car Run. The annual event takes place on the first Sunday in November, and it was started to celebrate the passing into law of the Locomotives on the Highway Act, which raised the speed limit for light locomotives from 4mph to 14mph and abolished the requirement for these vehicles to be preceded by a man on foot. Here Nigel Wilson captures some of the finest examples on the 2017 Run.

Just like the Cuckoo Fayre, The Christmas Tree Festival and the Mayor's Parade, this event has won its place in the heart of Cuckfield residents.

We're talking about the Christmas Lights on THAT house on the left, down Hatchgate Lane.

Mike and Wendy Jourdain are the hard-working couple who bring this festive light show to the village – raising money for charity and putting a smile on the faces of the people who walk by.

They first started decorating the outside of their house with Christmas lights in 2002, just for fun and it was low-key. Then the bar was raised.

"In 2004 we purchased a full nativity scene and my father-in-law, Colin, made a wooden stable and since then we haven't looked back," explains Mike.

So why do they do it?

"There are a few reasons," says Mike. "Firstly, we see it as an opportunity to raise awareness and money for good causes. Every penny donated goes to the cause.

"Secondly, we use the turning-on event as a way of bringing together the local community with mince pies, mulled wine and sweets and soft drinks for the kids.

"And finally, neighbours and their families, kids walking to Warden Park and commuters expect it."

Each year the Jourdains pick a different charity to benefit. In 2015 they raised £440 for Dementia UK, the previous year £420 went to Open Doors in Syria. In 2012 they generated £330 for the local Food Bank and in 2011 they raised £225 for Orchard House. Other charities to benefit include, Crisis, Help for Heroes, Chestnut Tree House, Yews Nursery and the Uganda Society for Disabled Children.

This year the Jourdains have chosen Off the Fence and its mobile shower unit campaign for the homeless in Brighton.

Mike was shocked by the plight of the homeless in Brighton, where more than 200 people sleep on the streets every night and where almost 3,000 people spend the night in places like tents, cars or car parks.

"Mental health is now the big issue with more than two thirds suffering from some issue, while 20 per cent of the homeless in Brighton are ex-servicemen," says Mike. "This charity will provide mobile showers, helping homeless people to stay clean and healthy. There are so many health issues related to poor hygiene."

When Cuckfield Life went to press they had already smashed their previous record by raising £1,073, helped by two donations of £100.

It takes Mike two days to get out the lights and test them and then a further three days to put them out.

"As we are not getting any younger we have decided to do it every two years.



Also during December, we normally have to undertake repairs – one year Frosty the Snowman's head flew off and disappeared down the lane. We eventually found all his parts including his nose!

"We also VERY thankful for all the people who have given up their time, free of charge over the years to help us. Special mention to Wendy's father Colin, Rodney (our loyal electrician) and this year Phillip (who helped put the stable and signs up).

"People tell us they love the lights. In 2012 we found a hand-written note, scribbled on the back of an envelope. We have kept it – it says 'Every single time I walk home drunk from Brighton, I love looking at these lights and donating. Please keep this up for years to come'.

"One boy from Warden Park said he was always so pleased to see the lights going up as it made him feel that Christmas was coming. Other local kids have thought that Santa and even baby Jesus lived in our loft!"

Firstly, let me say on behalf of the Community Interest Company a Happy New year to all Bolnore residents.

The new Tattoo Studio (right) has been open in the Village Square for a few weeks now and it really is good to see what was once an empty unit being used again. I have lived in Bolnore for just over five years now and I have never seen it in use until now. For the first time in my life I stepped over the threshold of a tattoo studio when I went in to welcome them to the village. I never thought I'd see the day! We wish them well, although if they wait for my business, they will be waiting a very long time!

The initial work has already begun for the redecoration, inside and out, of the apartment blocks with a view to commencing the work in the spring. # School won't become an Academy

Bolnore Village Primary School has withdrawn its proposal to convert to an academy with Sussex Learning Trust.

The School Governors decided, after two terms working through the due diligence process, that they valued their independence and the school's core values more than the benefits that would come from joining the academy.

A statement from the school's governing body said: "As part of our due diligence, Governors have taken into account where we have come from as a school in terms of being the first parent promoted primary school in the country. We have also carefully considered the benefits to the school of converting to an academy and the potential impact on our independence.

"We believe that, on balance, our autonomy, leadership and governance are too important to give up and indeed contribute to what makes us unique. As a result, we will not be pursuing joining Sussex Learning Trust this year.

"We would reiterate that our decision has been made principally around wanting to preserve our independence as a state maintained school for the near future."



# Party raised over £1,000


Cuckfield Golf Centre was the venue for a special Christmas party which raised over £1,000 with the help of many local businesses and 140 party-goers.

# **Cuckfield Golf Course**

### Remodelling using inert landfill proposal

Cuckfield Parish Council and Ansty & Staplefield Parish Council hosted a public meeting for the community and all interested parties to discuss the proposed plans for the remodelling of Cuckfield Golf course using Inert landfill. The application has a potential for major impact on both villages and the respective Parish Councils wanted to give the community the opportunity to understand the proposals.

It is important to understand the matter is not a formal planning application at this stage, with the final decision being made by West Sussex County Council. Both Parish Councils asked the applicant to share the proposal and to listen to feedback from the community.

The meeting was held at the Village Hall on Monday 20th November and was well attended by over 150 members of the community putting forward a robust set of questions to the proposals.

Community concerns were raised over a number of topics, including the quantity and frequency of HGV movements to bring in the landfill required for remodelling, numerous environmental issues on the

landscape and the type of material being bought in. The economic feasibility was also challenged along with the significant disruption to adjacent businesses and neighbours.

The applicant and Golf Club owner, Robert Dickman, explained the golf club needed investment and remodelling of the course to attract new members and attract tournaments and competitions.

Paul Taylor of PT-CE Limited represented the agents acting on behalf of Cuckfield Golf Course and provided an overview on the plans, landscape and design, ecology and HGV traffic considerations. The meeting concluded after 2½ hours with the applicant taking away the community concerns before they submit a planning application.

The Parish Council will continue to monitor the situation and provide further updates via the website and newsletter.

# Community Speed Watch

As part of trying to make our village safer, Cuckfield Parish Council now has a speed watch group. Thank you very much to the 16 volunteers who have completed their first stage of training. The second stage of training will be on 23rd January. We will then be able to go out with a speed gun monitoring the speed of traffic. The results will be sent to the police for any further action. If you feel you want to support your village in our efforts to make it a safer place, please register with our speed watch group by going online to www. communityspeedwatch.co.uk. Click on Join Existing Group and follow the instructions. The name of the group is Haywards Heath Cuckfield Parish Council.

Cuckfield Parish Council has purchased a Speed Indicator Device (SID). The SID is moved around the village to different locations and is providing us with some useful data. It also has the effect of slowing traffic down. When drivers see the speed they are travelling they generally show down. Below is a sample of some of the results we have achieved so far.

We are continuing to work on a project with West Sussex Highways to improve the safety of London Lane. The aim is to improve the environment for pedestrians. To date consultants have been engaged and we are waiting for the result of a full topographical survey before the scheme is adopted. West Sussex Highways will be holding their next gateway meeting in January at which the Parish Council will be in attendance. Preliminary plans will be available at the meeting. We will then be in a position to consult with residents. We are aiming to commence work during 2018. The basic proposal is to widen the pavement, introduce bollards along parts of it and to tarmac the two lay-bys.
