



# Rugby Club benefits from signal boost

Haywards Heath Rugby Club (HHRFC) has received £40,000 of funding from Mid Sussex District Council (MSDC) for the recent installation of a telephone transmitter atop their floodlights at Whitemans Green.

Described as a 'timely windfall' by HHRFC's Commercial Director, Phil Herbert, the one-off payment is planned to be used for urgent improvements to key facilities including reparation of the clubhouse roof and an unreliable boiler.

HHRFC, founded in 1950, is a very important part of the local community, with two successful senior teams, an occasional vets side and over 400 children taking part as juniors every weekend.

Pete Bradbury, MDSC Councillor for Cuckfield, said: "The Council always tries to work proactively with local community and sports organisations, and we have worked with the club to facilitate the installation of the new phone mast on the playing fields HHRFC rent from us at Whitemans Green. As well as improving mobile phone coverage in Cuckfield, the one-off payment that has been secured will fund badly needed improvements to the clubhouse building and allow the Club's great work to continue."



### Summer Exhibition continues

Cuckfield Museum has some beautiful objects in its new 'Reasons to be Cheerful' display which continues throughout the summer celebrating a royal birth and wedding. Because it is an accredited museum they are able to borrow from other larger museums and so Horsham has lent a finely carved oak cradle dating from the mid 17th century.

The Brighton Toy and Model Museum has lent a rare coral teether from the late 18th century, which incorporates bells and a whistle. Coral has been thought of as soothing aid for babies since classical times – it was smooth and cool and didn't splinter. It was also thought that the colour was energising!

Henfield has lent a beautiful Edwardian doll's pram in astonishingly good condition and a photo of the little girl with it at the beginning of the last century.

Philippa Malins, from the museum, explained: "We have also been very fortunate to borrow wedding dresses from a costume collector, Marion May, who has lent in particular a striking outfit from the 1870s worn by the daughter of the wealthy butcher of Funtingdon! Why she was in violet we don't know – we know that white and cream were made popular for brides only from the time of Queen Victoria's wedding in 1840, but they were colours reserved for the very wealthy or the aristocracy. Purple was a colour associated with the later stages of mourning, and so this is possibly a reason.

# Being green in Bolnore

Recycling waste is a topic that generates all sorts of comments. We all know that we should recycle more than we do, yet at every turn it seems to be more complicated. West Sussex County Council produce leaflets and posters telling us to recycle more but, try as we may, we sometimes get it wrong. We put our waste in the wrong bins – 20% of landfill waste in Bolnore Village, for example, could be recycled. To put this into context, this represents 170 wheelie bins a month!

In an ideal world every person would place waste in the correct bin. In the UK we are a long way from that ideal. We can do more to improve, and in Bolnore we are attempting to do that one item at a time – well, two items as it happens! Generally we recycle plastic bottles, but those items with triggers, such as hair sprays and home care products, present a problem. Whilst the bottle itself is recyclable, the triggers are not. So placing them in the recycle bin doesn't really achieve the objective. Every house in the Village will have at

least one of these items on a regular basis. All we are asking is that residents separate the triggers from the bottles and, the next time they passing the Bolnore Woodside, drop the triggers into the new bin provided by the Bolnore Village Community Interest Company. They will be collected and sent to a company that will recycle them properly. For those parents with small babies



and children who use the baby food pouches – the same applies. Don't put them in the landfill bin as probably happens now, keep them separately and deposit them in the bin provided at the Woodside. We are also working with the Co-Op to see if we can place additional bins within their store.

The Woodside is home to The Hub a 'before and after school club' as well as the Preschool. The bins are therefore ideally placed for the types of items we are looking for.

If we can make an impact with these two items, then we will consider increasing what each bin can accommodate – but for now we are trying to keep it as simple as possible.

One item at a time is all that is needed to begin to make a difference.

# **Barking in Bolnore**

'Hounds of the Heath' is a dog lovers' group that covers a lot of ground. Whether you want to meet like-minded dog owners for walks, want to find out more about dogs or are interested in getting a hound of your own, they're happy to help.

Started in early 2017 by Rebecca D'Arcy and Lynne Fever, the group already has over 500 members on Facebook. It runs deeper than just meeting for a chat and a stroll. When one of the members broke her hip, locals rallied around to make sure her beloved pup still got taken for regular walks at suitable times. In fact

someone will help out if you're just feeling a bit under the weather. The group has also made sure that lost dogs have been found safe and sound.

Group walks are organised roughly once a fortnight but, with so much interest, there are regular walks for smaller gatherings. Bluntswood is a popular destination, but other walks vary from Roost Hole to Redhouse Common to New England Woods.

# Space for grace



Dear friends.

On a recent break I visited the great Benedictine monastery of Monserrat situated high up in the dramatic mountain range inland from Barcelona. Founded in the 800s, it has experienced many vicissitudes during its long history. Napoleon burnt the complex down when he invaded Spain in the early 1800s, and what remained of the medieval ruins was then largely blown up in the anti-clerical period that followed. However, rebuilding recommenced almost immediately and has carried on well into the 20th century. The Spanish Civil War saw further turbulence, and 22 of the monks were executed by the Republicans controlling that part of Spain. In spite of this turmoil, it remains a great symbol of Catalonian culture.

High above the altar of the church is an ancient statue of the Virgin and the Child which is venerated by pilgrims who can travel up behind the sanctuary and spend time passing before it. Every day at 1pm the L'Escalonia – one of the oldest established boys' choirs in Europe – process into the church to sing an ancient hymn called the Salve Regina. On the day I visited there must have been nearly three thousand visitors and tourists crammed into the building. Every pew was taken, and the three aisles were full of people standing. It was a little like bedlam as the choir processed in, but the minute a single treble voice sounded through the air an extraordinary silence fell on this great assembly of so many different types of people. You have probably experienced moments like this yourselves, but I shall long remember that intensity of quiet listening and concentration from those present. There was something indefinable and wonderful in that silence.

We all need moments like this within our lives, and it is rare for me to enter the church without finding people taking time out and just sitting in silence within the building. We have recently started a short period of quiet prayer called 'Space for Grace'. Just a verse or two from the Bible, and then twenty minutes or so of silence – precious when so many of us are rushing around and frantically trying to catch up with things or sort other things out!

That experience in Monserrat was a reminder to me that all people, no matter who they are, need such moments, moments which take us outside of everyday experience – in the words of the psalmist in the Bible – where we are led 'beside the still waters' and our souls are restored (Psalm 23).

### Protecting your brand

### LISTEN TO THE LAWYER

By Martyn Gooch, partner Rohan Solicitors Question: I have created a brand name and logo for my business and want to stop others copying it, how can I do this?

**Answer:** Business owners commonly create and invent literary and artistic works (such as symbols, names and images) that are used to identify and promote their company. These devices can be a valuable asset of the business and, in many cases, it is possible to legally protect them to prevent competitors using them to their own advantage.

Trademarking is a way of protecting your company logo. If you have created a new and unique logo for your business it may be possible to protect it by registering it as a trade mark at the Intellectual Property Office. There are various rules regarding what can and cannot be registered. For example, generally the trade mark cannot include common surnames or place names or describe the goods or services that the business is selling. When you apply to register your trade mark, as part of the application process you must specify which goods or services you are seeking protection for. It is prudent to seek legal advice when considering applying to register a trade mark as if the application is incomplete or inaccurate it will be rejected.

A registered trade mark provides a business owner with effective protection against a competitor making improper and unauthorised use of their brand. When a trade mark has been formally registered in the UK the device (R) can be used next to the mark to warn others that it is protected under the Trade Marks Act 1994.

There are many advantages to registering a trade mark. As well as being a means of protecting your business identity, it can make people take your business more seriously and can help you position your products or services in the marketplace. It is also possible to register a trade mark in other territories, including Europe, the U.S.A and Australia. A registered trade mark can be a valuable asset and generally the more successful your business becomes the more valuable your trade mark is likely to be.

When your trade mark is registered, if you spot a competitor trying to use that trade mark, or one that it is very similar, it is possible that they may be infringing your legal rights and you may be entitled to bring a legal action against them to prevent it. Expert legal advice should be sought if you believe one of your competitors is using your trade mark without your permission.

have a plastic front and a cardboard back. These can be recycled as well - no need to fiddle about trying to separate the plastic from the cardboard.





Behind the Counter takes a peek into some of the things you may not know about our beloved shops and their owners. In this first edition we meet David Foord-Brown of David Foord-Brown Antiques, along with his partner, Sean Barry.

David grew up in Cuckfield and always had a passion for antiques. "When I was younger there were six antiques shops in Cuckfield," David mentioned, "and my parents didn't always see the trade as anything more than something that took place in a local village. I really wanted to take myself further." David begun his career by buying and selling items based out of his home before joining one of Bond Street's finest antiques and silver dealers. He then set his sights on the London markets such as Portobello.

Sean started life in the north of England and studied a degree in Fine Art at Preston Polytechnic. He started work at a printing business putting his skills to use before meeting David at a dinner party and moving to Sussex to start his own design business. "I packed up my things and hired a van," Sean explained, "knowing that for a good career I would need to move to London. I drove down on a Saturday and I was offered a role in the printer's by the following Tuesday."

While Sean focused on his own line of work, David took the plunge to leave London and open the first David Foord-Brown Antiques shop in 1988, which was actually across the road from the current shop, specialising in late 18th Century and early 19th Century furniture, porcelain and silver.

Sean moved into working in the industry while supporting David at an antiques show. "The organiser was having issues getting her IT equipment working," Sean told me, "and David decided to volunteer my skills to try and help. I went across to fix things and in return she offered me a lunch." At that moment Sean was offered a job as graphic designer and PR manager for the 30 antiques fairs that the company organised around the country. During his time at university Sean was required to record everything and developed his skills in photography and design. He took responsibility for designing all the adverts that went in the national press, brochures and photography of antiques.

In the late 90s David's business was growing, and he decided to move to the larger shop the duo are now based in. It was also during this time that David needed someone with the skills Sean had to help him manage his expanding workload. "We decided that, as



part of the move, we would go into business together," Sean recalled. "I wanted to stop running around the country and spend more time with David. We took a huge financial risk. I was giving up my job and we bought a new house at the same time." Thankfully it all paid off, and twenty years later the business is celebrating its 30th birthday.

Five years ago the premises were broken into. The door was battered down and the contents of the entire ground floor was stolen. "I nearly closed the shop after that, but then I thought 'no, if I do that then the buggers have won!" David said passionately.

The pair live locally, and the house they purchased 20 years ago has been an ongoing project, Sean said: "You needed a bit of vision to see it had potential. It hadn't been


touched since the 60s and I love a challenge."

When not working in the shop, both gentlemen enjoy gardening and have recently redesigned their outdoor space at home. They additionally have a love for classic

space at home. They additionally have a love for classic cars. While Sean drives a 1979 V8 engine Mercedes, you may catch David in his gold 1972 Rolls Royce Corniche convertible. "It's very understated," David interjected tongue in cheek!

According to David, Sean is also a dab hand in the kitchen. "I was good friends with the renowned cookery writer, the late Katie Stewart, who lived in the village," Sean revealed. "She would always give me copies of her new books and once even offered me some gold leaf following a photo shoot, so I could recreate her fabulous gold and champagne jellies recipe at a dinner party." When entertaining friends over food the couple's talents

go hand in hand. Whilst Sean enjoys being creative in the kitchen, David loves creating a spectacular dining table laden with Georgian silver and silver gilt.



If you're an aspiring business owner and looking for advice, here's what David had to say. "Start with what you know. For me, that was silver. We started at the bottom and built up from there. You have to get your foundations right and secure to be able to grow."


# A present from America



Jill was born in Hurstpierpoint and during the course of her life has lived in various places around East and West Sussex, including Haywards Heath and Crowborough, before settling in Cuckfield with her husband, Mark, in 1991.

As the youngest of five siblings, Jill had a father older than those of her peers, and when he became ill she was required to leave school and go to work. "I told the headmaster," Jill remembered, "and he told me I would make nothing of myself. Hmmph! The best he was prepared to do was to give me a reference for factory work, but I had other ideas!"

When Jill was at school girls weren't encouraged, like they are in current times, to aspire to things in the same way as men. She considered nursing but with the pay being so low she wasn't satisfied. "My dad had bought a touch typewriting course for me when I was 13," she reminisced. "I still remember the name as it was so funny to me at the time – Willy Scheidegger - but typing proved to be pivotal for my career." On completion of her first test Jill clocked 40 words per minute. On completion of her second and final test she was up to 70 words per minute and realised this was something to pursue.

Jill's first typing job was with an insurance company. She spent three months there, reorganised their filing system and was ready for something bigger. An opportunity came up at Gatwick Airport and, with sheer determination in her mind, she got the job and entered into the realm of computing.

Cut to a few years later and Jill's typing skills enabled her to join the IT team at Bain Dawes in Haywards Heath during its early years of computing. At this point she had trained herself in computer programming and business analysis to keep up with the changing times. After deputising a few times for her manager on a company logo change project at the London head office, she was asked by the General Manager to go to London and project manage the programmes associated with a company merger that would see the business become Bain Clarkson. "Initially it was difficult," Jill shared, "but I held my own, and as time went on I was accepted and seen to be a knowledgeable and trustworthy part of the operation."

Following 23 years moving through the ranks, Jill later worked for companies such as Royal and Sun Alliance and Accenture before joining EDF as a Service Manager with an offshore team in India. Jill mentioned: "I was fortunate enough to go out to India twice to work with the team and absolutely loved it. The colour, the local markets, the Taj Mahal – it was just stunning. What really touched me was the people - even those with very little had smiles on their faces."

In 2007 Jill's husband Mark developed lymphoma.



Following courses of chemotherapy over six years, Mark took early retirement and started to drop in to Friday coffee mornings at the Cuckfield Baptist Church (CBC). When treatment failed in 2013 and a bone marrow transplant was predicted an 8% success, Mark decided



to stop treatment and two weeks later he passed away.

"I rarely went to church, I didn't believe, but I was angry with God," Jill exclaimed. "Mark was only 57 and incredibly fit. On a nice day, he wouldn't think twice about cycling into London. He'd go for 200 miles or more and turn up for work the next morning. It seemed very unfair." However, Jill wanted someone who knew Mark to hold the funeral service, so she asked the pastor at Cuckfield Baptist Church (CBC) and was very touched with the help that was provided.

In 50 years Jill had only ever stepped into a church a handful of times, but following Mark's funeral she decided to acknowledge the help shown and attend the following Sunday at CBC. "No one knew I was going," Jill said, "but something in the teaching and the words of the songs spoke to me. It was strange. I didn't really know anyone, but I was amazed by the warmth and love shown to me – I had never felt anything like it. So I kept going and, after a few months, did a Christianity Explored course which answered all my questions, and after a year I was baptised."

Jill is now fully established in the church. "I haven't got children, although I am now a great great aunt,"
Jill added, "but I enjoy everyone else's! I help out with a Mother and Toddler group. The children are just too cute, and the mums are so lovely. I also help at the Friday coffee mornings, and I've also signed up to help at a Christian camp this summer."

Whilst Jill has a passion for fast cars and motor sport, she is a member of Speedwatch because she wants drivers to take more care in town areas, especially London Lane and by the schools. "I drove past the Wheatsheaf at night only recently and a boy slipped down the bank in front of me," she told me. "If I'd been

going more than  $30mph\,I$  wouldn't have been able to stop."

Jill took the decision to retire last year. "Working full time, running a house and juggling the business of life began to get too much," Jill said, "and following the passing of my husband I decided to retire and take up some new activities."

"I began to realise that I was only catching up with certain friends at weddings and funerals," Jill mentioned, "So last year, and with a little more time on my hands, I had a party at CBC to gather everyone I love and admire together." A great time, full of laughter, was had by all, and Jill has decided to make it an annual celebration.

If not at the church you will also see Jill playing her part as membership secretary in the Cuckfield Society (currently helping to plan the September Village Show); singing in the Cuckoo Choir; painting in watercolour classes at CBC; playing boules; going to a Jazz Club; helping with Speedwatch; U3A (University of the Third Age) Philosophy, Theatre and Visit London groups and going to the gym with the aim of beating last year's time in the Easter Walking Races or doing 'retail therapy' with her closest sister.

As we wrapped up the interview, Jill shared some advice for any upcoming retirees. "Start your network early," she said, "and if you're looking for friends, the church is a great place to start!"

If you're curious to know more about Jill's story you'll see her around in the village or at CBC on Friday or Sunday mornings.

P&S Gallagher has a long association with the village of Cuckfield, which dates back to when Patrick and Sandy ran J & R Matthews from their home on Church Street. Their son Matthew Gallagher, who now runs the business, remembers those times with fondness: "Our house was between the school and the

pub. As soon as I turned five my father lifted me up and over the school wall and into the playground! And we used to have a gate at the bottom of our garden which took you straight into the garden of The King's Head."

## How do you poo?

### DOCTOR, DOCTOR

Health and well-being are achieved, in part, when all of our bodily functions are running well, and this includes those we prefer not to mention!

Constipation is common and affects all of us at some time. Constipation means you go less often and, or, your stool may be hard and painful to pass. You can feel general discomfort or abdominal pain, bloating and nausea and you may not feel like eating.

Constipation may be caused by not taking in enough fibre or drinking enough fluid. It can also be a side effect of medication or related to an underlying medical condition.

Fibre is obtained through our diet via plant based foods. It is not digested and remains in the gut where it adds bulk to our stools and helps them pass through our system. Adequate fluid intake is crucial to prevent our stool from being dried out making it more firm and therefore painful to pass.

Medications, such as painkillers like co-codamol, are very bad at blocking up the system, as are iron tablets and some antacids. Tell your GP if you think your medication may be affecting you in this way. Medical conditions, particularly underactive thyroid, irritable bowel syndrome, some gut disorders or any condition which reduces general mobility (especially in elderly people) can also be the cause. Pregnancy and the resultant hormone changes slow the gut down and in the later stages the baby and enlarged womb itself can physically restrict the bowels from working properly.

For some a cause is never found despite a good diet, proper fluid intake and lack of illness or medication. This is common and known as functional constipation, mainly affecting women, and tends to start in childhood and persist through life.

Your local pharmacist will suggest a course of treatment to try in addition to ensuring you have a fibre rich diet, drink plenty and get some regular exercise. There are several different types of laxatives and the pharmacist can guide you to which will help most. It is very important to ensure good toilet posture as our anatomy is designed to work best to pass stools in a squatting position. The western toilet inhibits this posture but can be overcome by using a stool for your feet whenever you go. This replicates the squat by raising the knees above the hips and straightens out the bowel allowing gravity to work as it should.

Importantly everyone has their own individual bowel habit, therefore your doctor needs to know when it changes from your normal. You may need tests if regular constipation is new to you and lasts more than six weeks; this is known as change in bowel habit. If you try laxatives with no benefit or the symptoms are severe or accompanied by bleeding from your back passage; weight loss; bouts of diarrhoea; night-time symptoms; a family history of colon cancer or bowel disease like Crohns or other unexplained symptoms make an appointment.

### Paper Furniture

### **DESIGN AT HOME**

Do you need new chairs, a few stools or a coffee table? Perhaps it's time for a change in style and to also lessen your carbon footprint.

Mostly you would think that furniture is made from wood, mdf, metal, plastic or glass and expect it to be already constructed or to arrive as a flatpack. Now there is the option of paper too. Fantastic furnishings can be folded or expanded into amazing shapes and styles using craft paper or cardboard.

Such a versatile recyclable material, paper in its many forms has a multitude of uses.

Early examples of paper furniture were made from papier mache by the Victorians, famously by a Birmingham company Jennings and Bettridge. They glued sheets of black paper and placed them into moulds. Many pieces are now collectors items. Chairs are highly decorated in black, red or green, some have mother-of-pearl inlay www.papiermache.co.uk

Decoupage is a creative way of transforming an old, tired piece of furniture into a unique beautiful object by using cut pieces of paper. Create a design from magazine cuttings, wrapping paper or maps for example, gluing them on to the furniture and varnishing for that bespoke look.

Who would have thought, though, that paper itself could be used to create wonderful examples of chairs and stools using recycled paper so only generating small carbon footprints.

I have scoured the internet hunting for fabulous examples:

Lloyd Loom chairs, sofas and tables are paper based; craft paper is wrapped around wire and woven to make elegant, sturdy furniture allowing a little light to pass through (www.lloydloom.com). The furniture can be painted by the supplier or, for older pieces, sand and clean with a weak solution of washing up liquid before painting.

Looking at www.paperlounge.co.uk they supply fantastic honeycomb style furniture using recycled craft paper. Beautiful stools and benches.

www.yankodesign.com use corrugated cardboard for a very clever award winning design. The 'Octa' stool, using only three pieces of cardboard won the Asia Design Prize 2018 and generates only a small carbon footprint.

www.curbed.com for amazing stools created from recycled newspapers. The designer Woojai Lee turns newpapers into a polished brick like material to make stools and tables.

Personally I see chairs made from cardboard as works of art, such as the magnificent Wiggle Side Chair and all its beautiful curves. Designed by the architect Frank Gehry, as part of his furniture series 'Easy Edges', it is a beautiful robust curvy chair that would make a comfortable and unusual focal point for any interior.

### Portuguese Fish Cataplana (Serves 2)

Finely slice 1 large skinned onion and a red or yellow pepper (stem and seeds removed). Put into a wok or frypan (NO oil) together with 2 peeled and cubed medium baking potatoes. Mix together 200ml fish stock, 100ml dry white wine, 2-3 tbs tomato purée, a little garlic and a pinch of chilli flakes. Add to the pan, bring just to the boil, cover and cook over a low heat until the potatoes are just soft. Meanwhile cut about 400g firm fish into cubes (I have tried cod, haddock, salmon and pollock successfully). When the potatoes are just cooked add the fish on top of the vegetables, cover and cook for a few minutes until the fish is cooked. Season and serve.

### Mushroom Brioche

A very attractive and simple starter or light meal.

Preheat the oven 180°. For each person cut a thick slice from a brioche loaf and place on a baking sheet.

Peel and remove the stem from large flat or Portobello mushrooms. Blend soft butter with lots of crushed garlic and chopped herbs such as chives, oregano, thyme or basil and some finely grated lemon peel.

Spread a generous layer on each slice of brioche, place a mushroom on top and add a knob of the butter in each.

Bake for about 10 min or until the mushrooms are soft.

Top each with a thick slice of goats cheese (from a log) and return to the oven until bubbling and browned. Serve immediately.

You don't want a whole winters worth of soot sitting on the liner all summer when it is not being used. (You can still have fires if you get a cold spell as this will not put much soot on your liner compared to a whole winters worth).

Leaving your soot on the liner means it will harden and be more difficult to remove, plus, when mixed with moisture such as condensation or rain it will form a very mild acid (Hydrochloric and Sulphuric) that will eventually shorten the life of your liner.

On holiday in the Algarve it is well worth exploring a little inland from the large coastal resorts both to find stunning scenery and authentic Portuguese cooking. Small off-the-beaten track family run restaurants make you very welcome and serve excellent food. This is often simple dishes using ingredients very often home-grown or fresh from the sea. My fish recipe can be adapted many different ways and is very healthy. The name is that of the domed copper cooking vessel used and dates back to the 6th century. Actual amounts depend on the number of eaters, double up or more. Use just one fish, traditionally white or a mixture plus add mussels, prawns and squid if you like them.



## Apricots and Oranges with Saffron Honey Sauce (Serves 4-6)

The day before serving: measure 275ml water, 75ml orange juice, the juice and finely grated rind of 1 lemon, 75ml honey or agave syrup and 6 crushed cardamom pods into a pan and add 225g dried apricots. Bring just to the boil, cover and cook over a very low heat until they are plump and the liquid syrupy. Cool then refrigerate overnight. Also combine 2tbsp boiling water with a good pinch of saffron threads, crushing them with a spoon. Stir into 100ml clear honey, cool, cover and set to one side. Before serving add the segments cut from 2 large oranges to the apricots. To serve, spoon on to plates adding a spoonful of thick natural yogurt or a scoop of vanilla icecream then a drizzle of the saffron syrup.

## Green Salad Leaves with Herb Dressing

Into a blender or processor measure 3tbs fresh lemon juice, 1-2 crushed garlic cloves, 1tsp Dijon mustard, 2tsp caster sugar, 75ml extra virgin olive oil and 75 ml rapeseed oil. Buzz until well combined then season to taste. Pour into a screw-topped jar and add a generous handful of fresh chopped herbs. Store in the refrigerator. Just before serving drizzle over crisp green salad leaves and lightly toss together.


### **Allotments**

We are pleased to inform you that thanks to a kind donation from Holy Trinity School we now have a notice board installed at each allotment site for use by the Council and tenants to share information.











### **Cuckfield Village Clock**

Keen-eyed Cuckfieldians will no doubt have noticed that time is standing still on one side of our lovely village clock as it is minus its hands. The Parish Council are discussing repairs to the clock and is therefore in contact with the current owner of the building which has housed such an iconic item for so many years. Some interesting questions have been raised, and it has encouraged us to look into the history of the establishment of the clock and its ownership. Thanks to Cuckfield Museum we have photographic evidence that the clock was in situ on that particular building from at least the 1860s. Unfortunately, the Mid Sussex Times did not exist at that time but later newspaper articles have adverts for the Clock House shop to let in 1891 and show that in 1895 the Urban District Council of Cuckfield paid £15 for repairs and upkeep at that time, not including the scaffolding. Sadly, the costs have rocketed since then. An agreement was made on 1st August 1901 between the Urban District Council of Cuckfield and Thomas Best concerning access for maintenance of the Cuckfield

Village Clock. We can trace the history of Clock House as a village shop in various census and other records. It is a prominent landmark and was central to village life. In the 1890s a horse omnibus left the clock at regular intervals during the day to go to the railway station.

As yet we have not discovered who had the original idea of putting a clock on that particular building, though it is the ideal spot as it is very well placed to be seen from all directions. Was it paid for by public subscription perhaps? We do know that the Bowring Family were very generous in paying for restoration more recently and it is obviously a much loved feature of our village. A relic of our history which must be preserved.

At the demise of UDCC the clock then came under the aegis of Mid Sussex District Council and from MSDC to the newly formed Cuckfield Parish Council on 6th July 1987. CPC have been paying for the electricity and regular maintenance ever since.



### Queen's Hall

Those planning summer weddings will be interested to know that the Queen's Hall is now licensed for outdoor marriage ceremonies. The garden now has a lovely new gazebo. It is an excellent addition for other parties too. Watch out for further information in the near future.

### Speed Watch

Our speed watch group has now been running for four months. Thank you to our volunteers for the great work you are doing, however we still need more volunteers.

## **Speed Limit Sign**

Following consultation with WSCC we have recently moved the 30mph speed limit signs by 25 metres on the B2036 approach to the village with the aim of reducing the speed of traffic earlier before it enters the village. The signs are now further away from the junction of Church Platt which means the de-restriction signs are now further away from the junction with South Street thereby extending the village 30mph limit past Church Platt with the intention of making the junction safer. The situation will be monitored by our Speed Indicator Device (SID)

### Commemorative Bench

The Parish Council has been awarded £3,000 to commission Christian Funnell, a Sussex based sculptor, to produce a commemorative feathered bench in galvanised steel, which will be installed within the area of the unmarked babies' graves in Cuckfield churchyard. The sculpture will be a unique piece of art that people can sit on and reflect when they visit the area. The project will take about a year to design and produce. When the Parish Council has more information about the structure it will be added to Cuckfield Parish Council's website.


