

You may recall this photo of The Play Meadow at the end of Courtmead Road, Cuckfield, and the article in the February edition about a public footpath claim which has been made to recognise a public footpath that used to go through The Play Meadow for many years in the 20th century.

I asked you to think back to see if you could remember walking through this field as described above. It seems that this was a way that many local people took from the 1950s until the 1990s when the gates at the bottom may have been padlocked preventing through access to Newbury Pond and the old golf course beyond.

Start date announced for crossing

The long-standing campaign to install a pedestrian crossing on Isaacs Lane took a big step forward last month. It has been announced that work on the crossing, which will be located at the site of an existing pedestrian island on Isaacs Lane (A272) near the junction with Chownes Mead Lane, will begin on 29th July.

A petition to build the crossing was signed by more than 600 people over four years ago. Currently, approximately 150 children cross the busy road twice a day on the way to and from Warden Park.



The new crossing will enable children to walk and cycle safely to school and will provide a safe crossing point for other local residents too.

In addition to the new crossing, a shared-use footpath/cycle path on the Eastern side of Isaacs Lane will be built. This will link the new crossing with the existing footpath/cycle path at the Parkfield Way roundabout. Work will commence on the footpath at the end of September/beginning of October.

Recycling update in Bolnore

Back in the summer of 2018 the Community Interest Company began trialling a recycling scheme for a number of items that should not be placed in the blue lid bins. Our aims were to see if residents would be willing to take the necessary steps to separate these items, to see how easy or not it might be to dispose of them properly and to see if we could generate additional revenue as a result.

We concentrated on milk bottle tops, baby food pouches, air and home care triggers and pens and correcting fluid. Appropriate bins were placed at two locations: Bolnore Village Primary School and The Woodside. We have had mixed results!

I would like to thank the Primary School and The Woodside for their help and all residents who have made the effort to support this trial to date. So, what is the current situation?

Milk bottle tops

There has been some success here and, so far, we have collected about 10kgs of tops! These have been passed on to an existing and well managed process that generates revenue for the Hurstwood Park Neuroscience Centre. Our original plan was to raise funds for the Primary School but the volumes needed to be worthwhile were simply too great. We would get £60 per tonne and we estimate it would take many years and significant effort to raise £60! Far better to join forces with an existing process.

Baby food pouches

The collection point at The Woodside is consistently full and this is proving to be the most successful of our ventures. We have already passed on our first batch and received notification that our revenue stream is growing.

Home-care triggers

Our least successful venture! The company to whom we wanted to send these items has closed this stream.

Pens and correcting fluid

This is work in progress and we have simply been collecting these items ready for passing on to the recycling company. More news on this at a later date.

What happens now?

We will continue to collect milk bottle tops, baby food pouches and pens and correcting fluid. We have had to close the home-care trigger collection. These triggers should be removed from their bottles and placed in the landfill bin where they will be separated at the waste site and sold on to generate revenue for the Council. The bottles should be placed in the blue recycling bin.



Fish for thought

The search was on earlier this month to find Britain's best Young Fishmonger of the Year and lucky contender, Lorenzo Collett from Bolnore made it on to the shortlist as one of the four finalists for 2019.

The new award which was launched as part of the MFS Young Fishmonger of the Year competition is open to anyone under the age of 25 who has made a significant contribution to the fishmonger trade.

Lorenzo began his career as a trainee fishmonger at the tender age of 14 at the Fresh Fish Shop in Haywards Heath and in the last five years he has worked his way up to Shop Manager.

"I was given the job of Saturday boy and then I started doing every Friday. Last year I was offered a full time post where I began managing the shop and I have been doing that ever since."

All applicants that entered the competition were expected to do so by video, showcasing their technical knowledge whilst discussing their passion for the industry.

Lorenzo who is half Italian used to live in Milan as a young boy and remembers a fishmonger that lived in the town nearby.

"I once knew a fishmonger when we lived in Italy and whenever I would walk home from school he would come out of his shop and give me a piece of swordfish to take home. I guess that's where I got my first real taste of the sea and ever since have been enjoying fresh fish."

A main driver for Lorenzo is sustainability and to encourage responsible sourcing of seafood.

"Most of our fish comes from day boats; small local fisherman that work and get all of their jobs done during the day. Most of the fish that is caught is captured locally and some are even line caught."

What warms a heart more than the sound of an old tune or going beyond retro to a past decade to listen to a timeless soul classic?

Our guilty pleasures come in many different guises but, for those of us who simply want the chance to dance our cares away, what could be more inviting than stepping back in time to a place where the sounds of funk and soul once used to live.

Cuckfield resident and 'old skool' DJ, Dumani Ncube (AKA Dustee Du) knows exactly why because he inhabits that nostalgic bubble every weekend whilst delivering his radio show and club nights from behind the decks of his electric booth in Brighton and across the South East.

"These songs are a reminder of a time so, yes, there's a little bit of retrospection in there but for me it's about the music and always has been."

Dumani's story starts in East London where he grew up before moving to urban Essex with his family who left Zimbabwe for the UK in 1971 during the turbulent apartheid years.

His parents still live in that same house in Essex and, like most of us, he sees that time as a reminder of a place where memories were sweeter and times were simpler.

"Growing up in Essex in the 80s was brilliant. There was a real sense of unity where I used to live. Our neighbours would always look out for us. We were all friends. If I lost my key there they were. Doors and arms were wide open and all the children would play outside on the street together."

Fiercely proud, Dumani has a real appreciation of togetherness, of attitudes and of community. Perhaps something he learnt growing up in the backyards of Essex or possibly from visiting his parents' homeland in Zimbabwe where culture and community go hand in hand.

"We've been (to Zimbabwe) a number of times and, yes, some of what you see is tough. There's racism and the corruption is rife, but on the flip side when you see the country and its landscape you are aware of its warmth and beauty. The values of the people that live there are what really stand out. They have a lot of love to give and what they do have they share equally."

Dumani's first introduction to music was through his brother who used to DJ back in the day when disco and soul were at their height and vinyl was never in short supply.

"My brother had all these old LPs in the loft. That was what led me to start collecting my own vinyl, and it just grew from there. I used to do music at people's house parties or birthdays. I guess it really kicked off one night when I was out with a bunch of friends at a club in London and they said to me 'you've got an amazing collection of music, why don't you think of doing something like this'. And, well, here I am."

After school was over Dumani was determined to pursue a career in the Creative Arts, so he followed his heart to Middlesex University where he spent a year on his feet studying ballet, contemporary dance and street jazz. Learning how to 'arabesque' was not quite what he had envisioned, so he left London along with his record collection in search of life by the sea; all the way to Brighton University where he sang and acted (and danced a bit) as part of a Theatre and Visual Arts degree.

It was during his time at Brighton University that he was thrown a bone in the form of a golden work experience opportunity at Blue Note Records - a label originally founded in Germany in 1939 by Alfred Lion and Max Margulis. The name itself is derived from the blue notes of jazz (and the blues) and can be remembered as the label that once signed legendary talents John Coltrane, Dizzie Gillespie, Miles Davis and Herbie

"It was an incredible time. The label has a blue breaks section where hip hop artists sampled work from some of the original music. I was there at a time when the illustrators were coming into meetings and were deciding on what music they were going to put on the album. I was sat in an office that held the Blue Notes original back catalogue. Imagine that, being surrounded by some of the greatest music ever written."

Ten years ago Dumani decided to reconnect with some of his old music pals, and a plan was put in place to create a club night in Brighton. They found a venue, got a few DJs on board and Dumani pushed forward with the promotion for the gig. It ended up as one venue a month but has since developed into something much bigger. They now get to play 22 venues a month, give or take, and Dumani (along with close friend Adam Billingham) also has a prime slot on radio show 'Soul Casserole' that plays out across Brighton on the fourth Saturday of every month.

Nowadays when Dumani is not out on the road spinning his decks he works as a PR rep for a well known wholesaler and takes care of his family right here in Cuckfield.

So, just how does he manage to juggle his passion for music, his work life, time with his family and relax?

"That's easy. I have a very strong supportive partner. Without her I would struggle to do what I do. Let's just say she makes life a lot less complicated. We've not been here that long but the lovely thing about living in Cuckfield is the peace and quiet. My life is very busy, so coming back to the village means I can really enjoy some quality time at home with my family."

Much of Dumani's success as a DJ is clearly down to his positive attitude, affability and sheer determination. That and his killer smile. Last month he joined BBC6 music celebrity and DJ Craig Charles on stage at the Brixton Jamm – sharing a set with Craig is often a regular feature for him – before heading back to play his monthly spot at Savannah Bar in Haywards Heath.

Our conversation soon turns to the topic of musical inspirations and of key influences. Sure enough, great names like Otis Redding, Sam Cooke and Marvin Gaye all make it on to his list but after some careful thought Dumani brings it right back to where it all started, to home.

"For me, my main inspirations would have to be my two older brothers because without them I would not have the passion I have for music today."

Anyone who has taken to a dance floor and has experienced that feeling of exuberance that only the right music and the right moment can bring will understand that's where the magic truly happens.

A DJ is not just someone who plays records. He's a curator; someone who can manipulate music to create an atmosphere and tell a story. That's a gift. That's Dumani. That's Dustee Du.

Getting back to singing

As a child of eight, Paul Johnson was given the option to join the local parish church choir or the Cub Scouts. He didn't want to join the scouts so he reluctantly agreed to attend choir practice in the hope that it would only ever be just one practice.

And so began a major love in Paul's life. He enjoyed it so much that he spent most of his early 20s singing.

Sometime later on, however, Paul's singing just stopped.

"In that time I married, moved to Sussex and got myself involved at Lindfield URC, and later at Haywards Heath Baptist Church (HHBC) where Margarete, our children and I worshipped."

Now Paul is back singing in worship at Holy Trinity in Cuckfield.

"This has been the most amazing step for me. The church family at HHBC has been very understanding. Director of Music Richard Jenkinson works really hard to ensure that we do something 'choral' at every service."

Holy Trinity is a relatively small choir, many members of which are either retired or part way there and they simply want to do other things with their leisure time.

Paul adds: "We are a close group who enjoy having a laugh and not taking ourselves too seriously."



Life-saving knowledge

Where's your nearest defibrillator?

At Cuckfield Life we'd like to encourage everyone living and working in the village to familiarise themselves with the sites of the life-saving defibrillator machines in Cuckfield and Bolnore and learn how to use them.

Cuckfield resident Wendy Tracey-Roberts Macrae has been working hard to ensure that two new defibrillator units are back up and running in the village.

Fellow resident and local electrician Guy Richardson has joined Wendy in her fight for safety and has kindly offered to fit the new units for free.

One of the new units has been placed outside Mansell McTaggart Estate Agents on the High Street and will be in the safer coded cabinet. The second unit has been erected on Whitemans Green, again in a safer coded cabinet and with a built-in CCTV camera.

If you notice that the status light is red and not green that indicates a problem with the unit, so please ensure that you report it.

Wendy says that we can all do our bit to help by getting involved. "Once the units are up, it is our responsibility as a village to maintain and check them."

Funds are still being raised at the Co-op at Whitemans Green where buckets have been placed at the tills. Please look out for any orange donation boxes in any of the village pubs collecting money by the ISOC (Independent State of Cuckfield) for the purpose of maintaining these two units.

Wendy adds: "The units need replacement batteries and pads every 4-5 years; the pads cost around £45 and the batteries are £300. Ideally, we'd like to encourage the community as a whole to help towards the funding of these life-saving units."

Any local clubs should aim to register their details with the South East Coast Ambulance Service to enable any 999 call handlers to tell them where their nearest unit is in the village.

A third unit is currently being planned - please watch this space for further news.

If you are interested in finding out more, Wendy is organising a training session on the units but please be aware that there are limited places available. For additional information, please email Wendy direct at wendytrmacrae@aol.com.



Time to dust off your tennis whites, crack open the Pimm's and load up on your strawberries and cream as we swing into grass court season and head towards Wimbledon with Cuckfield Tennis Club.

Doug Mower, Chairman, explains the club's long history and how it has, over the years, attracted members from throughout the village and beyond. "A lot of people won't know this but the club has been around now for almost 100 years. In fact 2020 will be its centenary year. Next year we're hoping to organise some special events to honour the club, all the people who have played here and are still playing with us today."

Cuckfield Tennis Club was originally founded in 1920 when two smaller clubs amalgamated. At that time there were two courts in Vicarage Field but it wasn't until local resident Mrs Richard Worsley donated the recreation ground to the village that it became what it is today.

Even the onset of the Second World War didn't stop many of the players from playing. They were known as 'tennis soldiers' and would always want to play when they were back home. During the war years there was even a big challenge cup between Haywards Heath and Cuckfield (which, incidentally, Cuckfield won). The club also has a claim to fame as Edward Fox, the film and television actor, was a dedicated member during the 1940s.

Doug who took on the role for the club in June last year, says that they are keen to draw in some new faces for 2019.

"Our age ranges start from around five years old, and our oldest member, still playing today, is 92. But we're looking to increase and grow the membership of the club. We want to do that steadily though. Our retention rate is very good. Inevitably you'll lose people along the way but most of those who are with us stay on for many years."

Doug adds: "A few weeks back we were at the Cuckoo Fayre where we opened up the courts to locals. We were absolutely inundated. We had lots of young people queuing up to play. It was a great afternoon."

The courts at Cuckfield Tennis Club used to be managed by Mid Sussex District Council and were run much like the other clubs in the area, including Lindfield, Burgess Hill and Haywards Heath.

In 2016 that all changed when Cuckfield Tennis Club took out a 25 year lease with the council to lease the courts and grounds.

"That totally changed our status. All sorts of things took place around that time."

Those same courts remain open to the public and anyone can book online via Cuckfield Tennis Club. It costs £6 for an hour and any revenue earned goes straight back into the club.

The club is owned by the members who appoint a committee of seven, who currently all live in and around the village and who play at the club. Every year an AGM is held where the committee are appointed. The committee helps to advertise, promote and manage the club.

In 2017, following the takeover of the lease and some hard work by the committee, they were able to improve the grounds. More than £30,000 was spent resurfacing the courts.

Those funds came in the form of charitable donations from the local community and some money that had been collected from members over the years.

"We received generous donations from the Independent State of Cuckfield and the Mayor. There were also a number of other contributions made, all of which we remain most grateful."

One advantage of being part of a tennis club like Cuckfield is their affiliation with the LTA, also known as the Lawn Tennis Association; being associated with the LTA means that any member gets access to the Wimbledon draw.

"Based on membership numbers, the LTA will award pairs of tickets. Over the last few years, the club usually receives about ten pairs. These are mostly Centre or Number One Court tickets, on different days. What we do is we say to the members which tickets would you like – at the official standard rate of course – and enter their names into the draw and the first person out of the hat gets to choose which tickets they want most."

Gerry Canning has been Membership Secretary since 2010 and part of the club since the 1980s and explains what it is that makes the place so special.

"It's always been a very sociable club where good people meet. Those people are now my good friends. Some members may have left the club or moved on but what's great is that we all still keep in touch."

Doug's parents first met at the tennis club.


"Peggy, my Mum, was a member of the club. My Dad joined because back then it was just the sort of place you might meet someone and even fall in love. And that is



exactly what happened. Alan and Peggy fell in love and were married for almost sixty years."



Ansty Plant Sale



RECYCLE THIS...

Thank you for all your individual enquiries about your recycling. By the time you read this I will have replied individually to all your emails to the editor on recycling. Do keep the questions coming...

Plastic Bottle Tops



One of the most frequent questions I get asked is about plastic bottle tops, and in particular plastic milk bottle tops

The basic rule to remember is to remove all bottle tops before you recycle the bottles. Rinse the bottle, shake dry and it is then OK to recycle.

All your recycling needs to be Clean, Dry and Loose, and with the tops off.

All the lids are then placed into your black top rubbish bin, please.

Let me explain. Yes, the lids are plastic but it is the size that is the issue. When all your recycling arrives at the West Sussex Recycling plant at Ford, Nr Arundel, one of the first processes is to remove glass.

This is done by allowing the glass to fall through the holes in a large metal revolving drum called a Trommel, that breaks the glass. However, the small plastic lids are small enough to also fall through the holes and pollute the glass.

So do remember plastic milk bottle tops CANNOT be recycled in your blue top bin. No plastic lids smaller than coffee jar lid size please.

Did you know that charities collect these milk bottle tops, and raise money? There are various collection points in the area, but I know there is a collecting 'bin' at Princess Royal Hospital, which raises money for the Hurstwood Park Neurological Unit.

Would you like me to give a talk to your local group on recycling?

Do you have an individual question on specific items you are not sure how to recycle? One email to the Editor, with a picture if possible, and I can let you know.

Fresh berry tart

Instead of a large tart shell this filling could be spooned into brandy snap baskets or meringue shells. Serve up to two hours after making to avoid the pastry softening.

Tip a 250g Mascarpone cheese into a bowl and beat in 50g caster sugar and 3tbs lemon or lime jelly marmalade or lemon curd. Spread evenly in a 20cm baked pie shell. Pile fresh berries over the top. Melt 3tbs jelly marmalade and drizzle over the fruit. Alternatively sift icing sugar over the top just before serving.

Gypsy tart

This is a version of an old recipe developed in the Nestlè Test Kitchens way back in the 1960s. It is a strange recipe but a great favorite of butterscotch lovers.

Preheat oven 180°. Place a bought 18cm pastry case on a baking sheet. Whisk together 200g full fat evaporated milk, 225g soft brown sugar and 1tbs lemon juice. Pour into the pastry case and bake 30 mins. Remove from the oven and leave to stand 15min during which it will set firm. Serve warm or cold.

We have two important days to celebrate in the month of June – the traditional first day of summer, officially 21st June, and the relatively new Father's Day. Founded in Spokane, Washington, USA it was to complement Mother's Day and celebrate fatherhood. The first 'day' was in 1910 and initially was not a great success but by 1938 the commercial aspect was realised, especially by those manufacturers of male oriented gifts! Finally in 1966 President Lyndon Johnson designated the third Sunday in June as Father's Day and it became law in 1972. Maybe not celebrated quite so much here but why not make Dad a special cake or tart?



Chocolate rum cake

Preheat oven 180° and butter and line a 20cm loosebottomed cake tin. Sift 125g plain flour, 25g cocoa and 2tsp baking powder into large bowl. Stir in 125g soft brown sugar.

Whisk together 2 egg yolks, 6tbs rapeseed oil, 6tbs milk and 1tsp vanilla. Add to the dry ingredients and, with a wooden spoon, beat to a smooth batter. Beat 2 egg whites to stiff peaks and gently fold into the batter with a metal spoon. Tip into the cake tin, levelling the top. Bake for 45 min or until tests cooked.

Meanwhile measure 100g granulated sugar and 125ml water into a small pan. Warm over low heat until the sugar has melted then bring just to the boil. Stir in 2tbs rum. Prick the surface of the hot cake with a fork and spoon the syrup evenly over the top. Leave until cold before turning out on to a serving plate.

Whip 125ml double cream to soft peaks and swirl over the top of the cake. Chill for at least 2 hours. Just before serving sift a little cocoa powder over the top.




