Mid-Sussex junior archers excelled at the recent Indoor Sussex County Archery Indoor Championships, taking both the gold and the bronze medals in the team events.

Cuckfield Archery Club's junior team of Aoife Rice, Seb Dickie, Chris Jeffery and Holly Hatch took home the bronze medal, whilst the Ditchling Archery Club juniors claimed the gold. Cuckfield coach Bridget Dolan said: "The Ditching

Cuckfield coach Bridget Dolan said: "The Ditching team was always the hot favourite for the gold, as it was made up of some of the best youngsters in the county, but we were really thrilled at how well our own juniors performed."

The teenagers were competing against archers from Sussex and all over the South, including Essex, Hampshire and Oxford.

"The Cuckfield club was only started two years ago and had not entered the county championships before," added Bridget. "We knew our girls' team had talent, as they had already brought home the team trophy from a summer competition in Eastbourne, but this was the first time any of our junior boys had shot competitively."

Chris Jeffery, who was the Cuckfield team's top scorer, had only completed his beginner's course with the club in December but is already producing scores



to rival many of the club's adult members.

The Cuckfield Archers have a strong focus on inclusion and welcome members with physical and learning disabilities to train alongside able-bodied members at the weekly meetings at Warden Park Academy.

Young chefs in cookery competition

Cuckfield siblings Nathan and Holly Aylett have been cooking up a storm in a regional competition.

Nathan (Year 9) and sister Holly (Year 8) have been selected to go through to the West Sussex Finals of the National Create and Cook Competition - one of only four pairs of students selected from West Sussex Schools.

The southern area final takes place on 14th May at Chichester College in the catering kitchens, where they have to produce a two course meal for two people in 90 minutes using locally sourced produce. Their day will begin at 10am with students getting familiar with the surroundings and the competition starts at 11am. There will be four judges which, include a head chef from a local restaurant.

The menu, which Nathan and Holly hope will wow the judges, includes: Roast rack of South Downs lamb with fondant potatoes, chargrilled asparagus and pea and mint puree, followed by Montezuma's chocolate fondant with home-made vanilla ice cream and raspberries.



This spring, New England Wood is more beautiful than I have ever seen it.

The woodland floor is carpeted with an amazing host of wildflowers, white wood anemones or 'wind flowers' in drifts, violets and early bluebells contrasting with yellow celandines and primroses. Sunlight streaming through the trees, not yet dimmed by the newly developing leaves, spotlights all these plants that flower early before the green canopy turns the walks into cool shady corridors.

For those new to Cuckfield, the wood can be accessed from the corner of the recreation ground or the playing fields at Whitemans Green. Under threat from development, in 1981 the village clubbed together and bought the wood. It is managed by the New England Wood Trust for the people of the village as a nature reserve and for quiet recreation.

There is a wonderful diversity of life within the wood, not only innumerable species of wildflowers and plants but majestic trees, areas of coppice, butterflies, small mammals and birds. You may often hear the drumming of a greater spotted woodpecker or the 'tee-cher tee-cher' song of a great tit.

On Monday mornings a group of volunteers manage the wood to maintain and increase its biodiversity; coppicing, clearing glades and protecting valuable new saplings. Always fragile, such wonderful habitats need to be treated with great care.

The volunteers have also been working hard this last year on the main paths and bridges to make them easier to walk, especially in wet conditions. This has involved moving a mountain of wood chippings by wheelbarrow from the north entrance to paths throughout the wood

to cover base layers of cut and carefully laid branches. New steps and bridges have also been built. A grant from WSCC helped to pay for some of the materials for this work.

Hopefully now walkers can keep to the paths and not stray into the wild areas. Disturbance makes it harder for the birds and animals to thrive, and trampling those lovely spring flowers means fewer survive for next year.

Walking through New England Wood is always a wonderful experience, but there is no doubt that the bluebells are spectacular and will be at their best now. If you visit, please respect the nesting birds and keep dogs well under control.



An exclusive interview with Bill Gates would be the pinnacle of many journalist's career – but for Cuckfield's Arif Mohamed nothing beats the moment when he laid hands on his first published novel.

"It's incredible – the best feeling a writer can have," says Arif. "We were so excited and the children were all dancing round the kitchen!

"Seeing my work in print, and welcoming my family and friends to my book signings has been a dream!"

Arif, who writes under the name Joshua Raven, is the author of the 5fingers series of supernatural thrillers. "It's a quintet of five books – the first three, 5fingers: initiation, 5fingers: vortex and 5fingers: trinity have been published and the fourth is well underway," he says.

Aimed at teenagers and young adults, Arif's books have been hugely successful, with many readers eagerly awaiting the publication of the fourth, due later this year.

For Arif, it's the culmination of a dream which began when he was an avid young reader, spending many hours devouring books in Crawley Library.

Inspired by Tolkein, Tolstoy and Dickens, among others, Arif started writing when he was 15. After leaving school he studied English Language and Literature at Leeds University before training as a journalist in Portsmouth.

He went on to become a news reporter working on high profile publications, including The Times newspaper and Director Magazine, travelling extensively and interviewing high profile business leaders including Bill Gates and Michael Dell while working for several leading business/IT magazines. "My scoop on Gates got syndicated around the world," Arif recalled.

After meeting and marrying wife Phoebe, Arif changed direction. "We embarked on our 'American Adventure', moving to North Carolina to run counselling workshops in the Blue Ridge Mountains," said Arif.

"It involved taking married couples and teenagers into the mountains to spend a week with us getting counselling, confronting events from the past and ultimately healing. It was an amazing experience for us all."

On returning to England, the couple settled in Haywards Heath before discovering Cuckfield. "We moved to Cuckfield after the birth of our second child," Arif recalled. "We were attracted by the feel of the village and the sense of community."

The family immersed themselves in village life, joining the tennis club, supporting village events and Arif became a governor at Holy Trinity School. "I spent three years working with the amazing head teacher and staff," he said. "It was a real honour and privilege to work alongside such motivated and talented people."

But more importantly for Arif, the village inspired him to write. "The year we moved to Cuckfield was the year I was inspired to write 5fingers," he said.

"I love the fact that Cuckfield has so many creative people and as a writer that's very inspirational," he said. "I find inspiration all around me here – I walk across the fields surrounding the village and the ideas just flow.

"My children are a huge inspiration too, providing me with lots of new ideas, and you'll often see me sitting on a bench dictating my story or talking to myself as I walk into Haywards Heath."

The name Joshua Raven reflects Arif's fascination with the intriguing, dark and mysterious birds. "Rather



like the content of my books," he says. "Joshua is just a name I've always liked!"

The plots revolve around two central characters – 16 year old Rachel Race and 17 year old Lake Emmerson, who's a budding news reporter.

"The main character is based on several people I know really well," said Arif. "Lots of people have said they identify with her emotions and feelings of insecurity, isolation and sorrow."

Much of the story is set in a fictional seaside town – Griffton. "It's an amalgamation of several British seaside resorts," said Arif. "There's also a grand house that Cuckfield residents might just recognise....

"The books also span several countries featuring some of the places I have travelled to such as New York, Bali, Slovakia, and Tanzania."

The 5fingers books are already attracting a cult following and inspiring 'fan art' - when readers create and share their own illustrations from the books. "I've received some fantastic drawings of the panther chase in the first book, the dream fighter characters and lots of images of the main character," said Arif.

"She's quite striking; half Indian, half English, with black hair and blue dipped ends."

The books are pacey, exploring deep issues such as isolation, betrayal, friendship and hope. "The stories are plot driven but ask big questions about life and morality and can be enjoyed on a number of levels.

"And there's plenty of suspense, mystery and cliffhangers."

Arif is regularly invited into schools to run creative writing workshops and his books have been well received, even making their way on to the English curriculum.

He's been encouraged to find that, in spite of fears about young people's obsession with computer games, children are still reading widely and being creative.

"When I ask what they like to read I get a really good range of responses – from humour and romance to horror," said Arif.

"My passion is to encourage young people and adults to be creative and to enjoy reading and it's always a joy to see how creative and articulate young people can be." During his workshops, Arif challenges children to write stories in just six words. "I recently attended a World Book Day event at St Wilfrid's School in Crawley where more than half of the 150 pupils wanted to share their six word stories. It was amazing how different they were."

Arif is also 'author in residence' at two schools in Brittany, France, and runs creative writing courses for adults at Brantridge Park, near Balcombe. "It's wonderful to help adults create and write in such a beautiful setting."

Arif still works as a freelance writer for major companies including Hilton Hotels, Barclays and Microsoft, and enjoys the variation in his work. "No two days are ever the same," he said. "A recent week saw me writing thousands of words for a major blue chip company, running a copywriting training course in Luton, a creative writing event at a school near Bognor and a school assembly on the life of a writer!

He also recently performed at WordFest in Crawley along with other well established novelists. "That was particularly special as it took place in Crawley Library which was almost like a second home to me when I was growing up!"

Flexible work means being able to spend time with family and Arif is often at home at the end of the school day. "My work life balance is so much better now," he said. "It's a huge privilege to have this life."

An audio version of the first book is available, read by Joshua. "But if I could choose an actor to read my books it would have to be Morgan Freeman," he says.

"It would be wonderful to see them made into films too!"

Later this month Arif will be taking himself off to the New Forest to put the finishing touches to his fourth book before handing it over to seven editors and a cover designer.

Then work starts on book five. "It's a bit like building a house – counting out the bricks and knowing how you are going to build it," said Arif. "Finishing will feel like reaching the summit of a mountain. Maybe then I'll take a holiday!"

Here is a lovely spring salad, fresh and easy to prepare and you can serve it with so many lovely things. We like to serve the Nicoise with a charred and cured salmon which really brings an elegant side to the dish. I hope you enjoy making this but, if you don't have the time, come in and I will serve you our beautiful starter from the menu.



Salad Nicoise

Serves 4 people

Ingredients

For the dressing

- 2 garlic cloves, peeled, finely chopped
- 175ml/6fl oz. extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tbsp red wine vinegar
- pinch sea salt
- freshly ground black pepper

Method

- For the dressing, whisk the garlic and oil together in a bowl.
- Place the eggs into a saucepan and cover with cold water. Bring up to the boil, switch off the heat and leave for five minutes. Cool under a cold running tap for 2-3 minutes and then peel the eggs.

For the salad

- · 4 radish, finally sliced
- 4 free-range eggs
- 4 very ripe tomatoes, skinned and quartered
- 16 black olives
- 4 spring onions, sliced
- handful fine green beans, topped, tailed, blanched
- 1 tin anchovies in olive oil (or 1 tin good quality tuna belly in olive oil)
- · 1 tbsp freshly chopped chervil
- · small handful fresh basil
- For the salad, arrange all of the salad ingredients (except the chervil and basil) in a shallow dish. Pour over the vinegar and garlic oil and season to taste with salt and freshly ground black pepper.
- 4. Finish with a sprinkling of chervil and basil and serve at the table.

Becoming a designer

DESIGN AT HOME

One of the exciting elements about being an interior designer is the initial learning process which is required to achieve a suitable qualification in interior design. Having done so, practice and expertise results in inspiration and ideas when working on a project. My studies included a wide range of subjects focusing on visualising spaces in both residential and commercial sectors. I particularly enjoyed learning the history of interior design which took me back to the classical interiors and architecture of Ancient Greece and Rome, their stunning work being the foundation of modern design. Reading about and seeing beautiful interiors created throughout history across Europe has made a lasting impression on me and given me a tremendous admiration of the creators.

Today, trends in interior design continue to evolve and many age old crafts have been replaced with machine made items which are still beautiful but it's the handmade objects which add a unique touch to the interior. A stunning hand knotted rug, an original painting or hand crafted piece of furniture etc creates a unique interior and generates wow factor.

Style reflects personality and many people enjoy decorating, DIY, up-cycling and updating their homes. However, if you're not that way inclined and become stuck for ideas as to what to do with your living space (such as decoration, extending a room, adding another bedroom or knocking down walls) to achieve the best possible outcome, perhaps you should consider hiring an interior designer who is a member of BIID (the British Institute of Interior Design). You might ask yourself, what is an interior designer? People have different ideas. Many mention paints, wallpaper and cushions but the true definition given by the BIID includes "Qualified by education, experience and applied skills..."An interior designer can alter floor plans, visualise spaces, create lighting plans, pass on knowledge about materials and surfaces and finish the interior with bespoke furnishings and fittings not seen on the high street.

After taking many details from the client, including a budget, use of space and how many people will use it etc, the designer will compose a brief and will work hard to come up with ideas. Visuals include perspective drawings, sketches, a floor plan, images and fabric samples, flooring samples etc, all presented on a mood board. A designer will have a good eye for colour and not be limited to one style, as the style is all about the client and if done successfully means that their personality will shine through. Having the interior project managed by the designer and refurbished by his or her team of tradespeople means that the whole project should be hassle free.

There are different levels of entry into the BIID depending on qualifications and experience, including a level for students should you be interested in joining. The institute is currently celebrating 50 years and working hard to regulate the profession.





Unseen society

VILLAGE GREEN

Here we are in the Merry Month of May. My heart has been very merry this spring as beauty unfolded all around. New songs joined the birds' chorus with great, furry queen bumble bees adding a base note as the myriad of blooms celebrated the warmth of the sun after the grey, still winter. A friend mentioned having heard a cuckoo, but not in Cuckfield sadly. If you hear that iconic call when out and about, give a thought of gratitude and a hope for all the endangered species at risk in the world.

Recently this expression came to mind – 'sharing the unseen society's living space'. Does this mean coming face to face with a large spider behind a curtain or finding all kinds of creepy crawlies under a stone? These are in our own living space. Upon reflection I was taken to the bees, not just in Sussex but in other countries too. The bees that pollinate the almond blossoms in the great orchards of California and the sea creatures and birds of the Pacific ocean are hidden from us here. However, the world is one global community so the unseen bees dying in large numbers as their colonies collapse in California and the marine creatures and birds dying from eating our plastic rubbish are in our living space too. Thomas Berry has this to say, "the universe is a community of subjects not a collection of objects".

Recently I met an unseen local member of my society. My father had an expression that he would use – 'You learn something new every day'. The little insect that I met was bee-like, hovered and had a long proboscis. Excitedly I took photographs and thought it something rare and extraordinary. Having drawn a blank in identifying the great discovery I had a chat with the lovely lady on Sussex Wildlife Trust's Wild Call (01273 494777), "Oh yes. That's a bee fly," she said. "They're quite common but this year we have had more enquiries and reports than usual." I did learn something new that day but everyone I spoke to about bee flies seemed to know about them already. Hey Ho! So much for rare species.

Now for a book review. Tony Juniper, environmental campaigner, writer and advisor, has a new book 'What Nature does for Britain'. This looks at how our environment provides the things we need – soil, water, food, health, energy – and concludes that our economic system is working against our own best interests. His solution is to work with nature rather than against it. Reading his earlier book 'What has Nature ever done for us?' was a real eye opener. There is so much about natural capital that I didn't know. If this appeals, get a copy one day and find new things to learn.
